- We will learn to be self-confident and resilient when making a football kit and engaging in activities on our school trip to Irchester Park.
- We will be creative when solving problems.

As programmers:

- We will use information technology such as Google Maps to look at our local area.
- We will look at how to stay safe when using the internet.
- We will learn what an algorithm is.
- We will predict the behaviour of simple programs using Bee-Bots and Turtle Academy.

As designers:

- We will explore a range of existing uniforms.
- We will design, make and evaluate a football kit for a bear.

As readers:

- We will continue to apply our phonic knowledge when reading books and maps.
- We will read a range of historic sources that will inform us about the life of Walter Tull.
- We will read a range of poems and books about materials.

As global citizens:

- We will learn how to keep safe in our local environment.

A scientists:

- We will identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials for making a football kit.

- We will work scientifically when working with materials to make a football kit.
- We will look at the weather and how our surroundings change across the seasons.

As historians:

- We will study the life of Walter Tull who was a football player within our locality.
- We will compare how uniforms have changed over time.
- We will use a range of sources to learn about Walter Tull.

As sports people:

- We will be use teamwork and leadership to participate in team games.

As musicians:
